At Aston Academy we value input from parents/carers and aim to work with you to support your son/daughter to achieve their full potential. To achieve this, we held our first **parents/carer forum meeting** on Thursday 17th November and have spoken to many other parents via telephone meetings.

Agenda November 2022

1) Changes to the Monitoring Data Parents / Carers receive every Term.

Monitoring data has been a focus for the forum for the last few meetings with changes being made based on the feedback we receive. Below is a summary of the feedback in to school with last years monitoring data.

 KS4 – Largely unchanged – KS4 monitoring has been positive for parents/carers and students to support progress.

Students Get a report showing:

- Target Grade
- · Working at (assessment) Grade
- Attitude towards Learning Score
- KS3 Monitoring Data
 - Feedback indicated parent/carers could not access reports.
 - Parents/carers did not understand the curriculum information in the way it was published.
 - Seen a too generic.
 - Comments didn't link to improvements students needed to make explicitly enough.
 - Faculties, were not using the data effectively to identify cohorts that required targeting.
 - Heads of Faculty were not able to use the data when working with staff.

ACTION TAKEN with KS3 Monitoring Data

- All faculties will assess students in a common format for all students.
- Each student will get a mark for their assessment.
- Students will have their mark compared to all students who are of similar ability.
- We will analyse the results to determine how well students performed compared to their peers of similar ability

2) Feedback on the Parent / Carer Survey sent out in November

In November we sent out a survey to parents and carers of all students in the academy. The main points of feedback shared with the forum:

• Parents/carers expressed concern about some crowding in toilet areas.

ACTION TAKEN - We have enhanced duty staff in these areas at breaktimes and lunchtimes and split toilet areas into upper and lower school year groups - ensuring efficient queue management so that all students can access the toilet when they need to.

Parents/carers expressed that home/school communication was starting to improve.

ACTION TAKEN -We will continue to use school gateway, Twitter and direct correspondence in order to ensure that parents are kept up to date with life in the Academy.

• Parents/carers have been overwhelmingly in support of the mobile phone policy and the positive impact this has had around the academy.

ACTION TAKEN - We thank you for your support of the refreshed behaviour policy, launched in January.

 Some parents/carers questioned the necessity of daily uniform checks on the gate each morning.

ACTION TAKEN - Please understand that we will continue to strive for the highest standards of compliance with the school uniform policy - please check this on the website if you are unsure about anything.
